

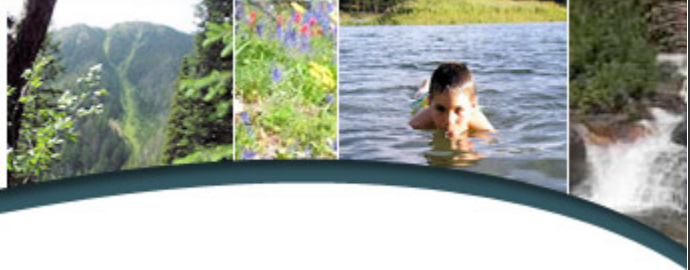

As he stated in 1990, "I've been thinking about the footprint we all leave. I want to make sure all mine are in order."

His life was one of man in balance with nature and he spoke often in metaphor, reflecting his life's close association with the land, water, and the critters with whom he shared the world.
